Ron Hornaday Jr. has won 47 of 399 truck races. Kyle Busch, Mike Skinner and Jack Sprague are second on the series' all-time race winners list with 28 each.

Hornaday, who also holds the series record with four titles, is hoping to rebound after a costly penalty for a rules violation that occurred at Charlotte. He was docked 25 points while crew chief Jeff Hensley received a \$10,000 fine after NASCAR officials discovered an unapproved final drive (rear end) gear ratio on Hornaday's No.33 Kevin Harvick Inc. Chevrolet during post- race inspection...More
